Children, obey your parents in everything for this pleases the LORD.

LITTLE TWIGS: In our weekly gatherings we engage in teaching God's truth and responding through singing, collective prayer and liturgical readings. We believe it is important for our children to see, hear, and experience God's Word and His people responding in worship. In this way we corporately seek to raise children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord (Eph 6:4), so children remain in worship and teaching with the adults.

Here are a few ideas to engage your little ones in the service today:

- Each week sermon passages are listed in the handout; before church on Sunday read the Scripture being taught out loud as a family and pick out key words in the passage.
- Have your children listen and pat your arm, make a mark, draw a circle, or count the number of times those key words come up in the sermon.
- Incentivize success with rewards or snacks
- Pick up a "Little Twigs" plastic tote in the entry way before church.
- Ask your little one to draw a picture of the things they are hearing in the sermon.
- Have your child help with offering.
- After church take your child to "Little Twigs" where they hear a summary of the sermon, ask them what they learned.

MAIN POINT: Kingdom minded children who live in-line with God's design by obeying and honoring their parents; honor God, strengthen their family, invite blessing, and build the Kingdom.

Notice a couple things right from the start:

- 1. "Children" God presents children as valuable to the LORD and His Kingdom as present contributors;
- 2. "Obey" there is a shift in wording; "submission" (v. 21, 22, 24), now the word used toward children is "obey."
 - **Submission** = Suggests having developed ideas or understanding yet **yielding** or **surrendering** to those over you.
 - **Obedience** = Following orders or rules, focusing on action even if ideas or opinions are not yet formed or understood.
- 3. "Honor" expands the understanding of obedience it carries obedience further = respect, value, and care.

 Obedience is tied to a specific life stage, while honoring is a lifelong duty

Children: obey your parents without delay, without debate, without display.

The phrase "in the LORD" qualifies two important things:

- Direction: Obedience to your parents by faith IS obeying/honoring the LORD and invokes blessing.
- **Protection:** Obedience is framed by alignment with the Lord's teachings and righteousness. If were to ask a child to sin: lie, steal, or harm someone), the child would not be obligated to obey in that instance.

Learning to obey and honor, will set you up for good, and to do good to others.

- Negatively stated: If you disobey and dishonor your parents, life is going to be very hard for you.
- Positively stated: Obeying and honoring your parents, will bring blessing, goodness, and flourishing in your life. (Ex20:12, Duet 5:16

Adult Children: honoring suggests a distinction and continuation.

- Obedience, once an adult child establishes independence; *leaving and cleaving*, forming their own household; living apart, and living financially self-sufficient... then expectation of *strict* obedience to parents diminishes.
- HONORING your parents is a life-long responsibility and also carries with it the promise of blessing. (Mark 3:20-35, John 19:26-27)

Honor = "to give weight" or "to esteem" – HONOR resolves to **exalt** the positive aspects of **your parents** and their role and **give grace** to their weaknesses.

When we obey and honor our parents "In the LORD" God unleashes all the blessings of his first commandment

APPLICATION:

Parents:

- 1. Teach your children to OBEY without delay, without debate, without display, and without exasperating them,
- 2. Keep the core principles developed in Ephesians as foundation for your parenting: Christ at the center, Grace permeated, Adjusting heart and behavior
- 3. **This is** <u>THE JOB</u> **of Kingdom Minded Parents to focus our full attention.** You could do no better in helping your children on their way to flourishing, stability, and the blessing of God!

Young Children:

- 1. Obey your parents without delay, without debate, without display
- 2. This is the clear unmistakable way you build God's Kingdom
- 3. Enjoy stability, blessing, and flourishing.

Adult Children:

- 1. Resolve to exalt the positive aspects of your parents and give grace to their weaknesses
- 2. Seek & Value the wisdom of your parents
- 3. Prioritize the joyful, physical, and relational support of your parents. 1 Timothy 5:8
