Living Under the Law of Liberty (Partiality, James 2:1-13)

James in his letter sets out to teach us that faith **works** – faith results in action. Real faith inside of every believer should bear fruit – should come out in a way that's visible. In other words – we will do what we truly believe. He encourages us to take joy in trials, because this faith that we have grows in steadfastness – and we become more complete.

Partiality, favoritism or "bias" is antithetical to the Lord of Glory. It is ungodly, unmerciful, unjust, and evil. *My brothers, show no partiality as you hold the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory.* (James 2:1)

James' Example: Rich guest, Poor guest.

- 1. The rich man is honored, is perceived as beneficial
- 2. The poor man is dishonored, perceived as unable to provide any benefit

Proper deference and honor does have its place, but partiality is a sinful, evil judgment: v4 have you not then made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts?

The sin of partiality is making an unwarranted distinction; driven by the self-serving motives. It is a demonstration of unfaithfulness. It is a sin for these reasons:

- 1. IMpartiality is a character trait of God. (Rom 2:11, 1 Sam 16:7, Eph 6:9)
- 2. IMpartiality is a Law of God. (Lev 19:15, Deut 16:19)
- 3. Partiality goes against the LORD OF GLORY'S missions. (Luke 4:18)

The DIRECTIVE, or CHARGE given to us by James: **SO SPEAK and SO ACT as those who are to be judged under the LAW OF LIBERTY**. (James 1:12)

The Law of Liberty:

- is Jesus' redemptive law of love that Christians live by
- is the love of God and others, fulfilled by FAITH working through LOVE
- requires the Holy Spirit's power
- is merciful and liberating

"For judgment is without mercy to one who has shown no mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment."

Partiality, being corrupt, ungodly judgment, is merciless.

- Those with false faith or dead faith are in danger of merciless judgment.
- Those outside the faith will not have the benefit of any mercy on judgment day. In other words: if Jesus is not your savior, you will receive no mercy from God! (*Parable of the Unforgiving Servant, Matthew 18.*)

Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful. (Luke 6:37)

Mercy triumphs over judgment. God in His mercy fulfilled justice by transferring judgment for sin onto to Jesus.

- 1. Live as those who are to be judged under the law of liberty: Love God, Love others
- 2. Put aside partiality, which is unfaithful and unloving.
- 3. Treat everyone as Jesus would, with mercy; born from faith working through love.
