James 4:13-5:12

James delivers a hardcore sermon to their persecutors: (The Whoopin' of the Rich)

He tells them: Your life is a vapor, your boasting is evil, and your wealth will be a witness against you in the impending judgement because of your many sins against the poor.

This is encouragement: James comforts the believers by allowing them to see what's in store for their persecutors.

Take heart!

The evil doers will get what's coming to them Wait in faith for the judgement - which is going to be good thing

Don't grumble, but have patience in the meantime -

like Job and the Prophets did

Flee faithless idolatry - don't make oaths on created things

Encouragement is given in the promise of "justice will be done." In the meantime, humble reliance on God; patience in suffering, righteousness, and prayer are the works of faith necessary to navigate trials and uncertainties, live in the light, and restore those who have wandered.

In the meantime:

Pray in suffering! Sing praise in times of gladness! "Is any merry? let him sing psalms." Singing lifts the heart further and glorifies the Lord to a wider audience Our time of worship together is a faith-building, faith-strengthening exercise, and you should never skip the fellowship of the saints.

5:14 "Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. 15 And the prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven."

James offers a simple, sensible charge – call the elders and have them come and pray for you. This would apply to not only for physical sickness, but for any sickness, weakness or feebleness including the sickness of sin and a weak faith. There is a strengthening, healing power in faithful prayer.

Confess sins, be forgiven, and live in the LIGHT!

Go get the wanderers, and bring them back! To rescue a wandering Christian is to pull him back into the life of faith, where they will go from "just hearing" the word to obeying it. This rescue will cover a multitude of sins.

- 1) Read James for the rest of your lives: Start a Bible reading plan and stick with it.
- 2) Take joy in Trials. 1:2-4: Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness...
- 3) Don't neglect the doing! 1:22: "But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves."
- 4) Stay humble. 4:10: "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you."
- 5) Stay in fellowship and pray! The life of faith is not the life of a loner. Confess your sins, be forgiven, pray, and stay in the light! 5:16 Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.
