I Timothy 3:1-7

The saying is trustworthy: If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task. ² Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, ³ not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. 4 He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, ⁵ for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God's church? 6 He must not be a recent convert, or he may become puffed up with conceit and fall into the condemnation of the devil. ⁷ Moreover, he must be well thought of by outsiders, so that he may not fall into disgrace, into a snare of the devil.

CONTEXT:

Timothy's task is to build spiritual walls. "Guard the Truth that leads to life." One of Timothy's main tasks in Ephesus is to develop leaders. And these need to be **qualified in the exact same areas they are calling people to follow**. The listed qualifications in 1 Timothy 3 are for the **leaders specifically, men in particular, and the church in general**.

The Goal for members of God's Household:

- 1:5 The Aim = love issuing from a pure heart and good conscious and sincere faith.
- 3:15 To behaving rightly as the household of God, the church of the living God who upholds truth in word and deed.
- 6:11 Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness. Fight the fight of faith. Take hold of eternal life.

1 Timothy 3 can be applied by three groups of people who make up the church:

- 1. **Church in general** If you are a Christian, these characteristics are mandates/aspirations for you whether you are a man, woman, married, single, young, and old.
- 2. **Men in Particular** Because men are specifically designed to **lead, tend, protect** all men of all ages, whether you aspire to official leadership or not, can take make direct application of 1 Timothy 3.
- 3. **Leaders Specifically** (Overseer's/Elders)—This is the primary focus of the passage, those who aspire to lead God's people have a calling not just in role, but also in exemplary **mindset** and **behavior** as living examples of God's Word applied. "Follow me as I follow Christ" (1 Cor 11:1).

1 Timothy 3:1 The first qualification; "Aspiration" = ambition to achieve. The under-sheperd is to have a heart like the Chief Shepherd! (1 Peter 5:2-4)

The Heart of Shepherd (Gen 15:1-18)

- 1. God engages Abram
 - God promise to make Abram and his family into a redemptive nation
 - God says I'll do it, Abram believes him, credited as righteousness
- 2. God's covenant with Abram
 - The LORD binds the contract, "When this covenant is broken, I will be torn to pieces."
- 3. Covenant Fulfilled in Jesus
 - Jesus, The Good Shepherd, lays down his life for the sheep
 - God says in Gen 15, "I will do it!" Jesus says in John 19:36 "It is finished!"

The Example of the Chief Shepherd (John 10:1-15)

- V. 3 "The sheep **hear his voice**, and he calls his own sheep **by name** and leads them out."
- V. 4 "He goes before them and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice."
- V. 13 The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep."
- V 14, "I know my own and my own know me... I lay down my life for the sheep!"

"The HEART of the under-shepherd in pursuit of the Chief-Shepherd is the foundation for the qualifications!"
