Acts 17:1-10

Thesis Statement: In Acts 17:1–10, the birth of the Thessalonian church reveals that Jesus Christ, the suffering, and risen KING, demands our joyful allegiance, transforms lives through His gospel, and empowers us to stand firm under internal and external pressure.

Paul Arrives in Thessalonica (Acts 17:1)

- After preaching in Philippi Paul, Silas, and Timothy arrive undeterred in Thessalonica.
- Paul is led by the Spirit to proclaim the gospel in Thessalonica, a intentional location from where the Gospel can effectively spread.

2. Paul's Preaching in the Synagogue (Acts 17:2)

- The power of God's Word
- The **power** of a community of people bending themselves to His Word.
- The **power** of the Gospel

Power of God's Word (Acts 17:2b)

- Paul doesn't just preach; he explains and proves that the Messiah had to suffer and rise.
- Paul teaches through the Messiah's suffering and resurrection were God's plan all along. Isaiah 52:13-14, Isaiah 53:5-6, Psalm 16:10

The power of a community of people bending themselves to God's Word (Acts 17:3)

- Paul faithfully begins his ministry in the synagogue, underscoring the pivotal role of the Jewish community
- The Jews' devotion, morality, & study of God's Word created a powerful witness that attracted many Gentiles, known as "God-fearers."
- When Paul enters the synagogue, it is filled with a mixed crowd containing *many* gentile Greeks.
- God's redemptive plan is marching forward through flawed people.
- The primary vehicle for moving God's truth into the world is HIS church; But it is not the church itself, but the message it proclaims!

The Power of the Gospel (Acts 17:3,4)

- "Christ" = "Anointed One," the promised King from David's line (2 Samuel 7:12-13).
- Jesus is The Sovereign KING, this is central to Paul's message, not only for the Jews, but the entire world. Rom 1:16

The People's Response (Acts 17:4)

- Some Jews in the synagogue are persuaded.
- "areat many Greeks" —Gentiles who worshipped God but weren't Jews—also believe.
- "Not a few leading women," = many, significant, a lot of influential women of the city,
- The gospel unites people under the kingship of Christ. Gal 3:28

The Opposition Arises (Acts 17:5) 7.

- Some Jews, stir up trouble recruiting hired thugs/rioters Jealousy fuels this opposition and flows out of the "religious community"
- The gospel threatens control and status and personal comfort.
- God's plan of redemption has and will continue to move forward. And it moves through the faithfulness of the Thessalonian church.

Persecution and the Bold Claim (Acts 17:6–9) 8.

- Jason (who had welcomed the apostles) and other believers are accused of treason = explosive accusation
- But the believers won't back down; The church of Jews, Greeks, Men, Women, "Receive the Word in much affliction... with joy... sound forth God's Word... their faith goes out everywhere (1 Thes 1:3-7). And, these are the believers Paul sends a letter of encouragement, inspiration, and further instruction = 1 Thessalonians

APPLICATION:

- 1. Proclaim the Gospel Boldly Proclaim Jesus as the Christ, in all areas of relationship and life
- Live in Unified Community Foster unity and relationships reflecting the gospel's power to bring people together.
- **Stand Firm Under Pressure** Remain steadfast in allegiance to Jesus hold fast to the truth of the gospel.
- Go Out Everywhere Live in a way that your words and actions proclaim the GLORY of Jesus Christ.
